Ground Breaking Event Attended by Regional Leaders in Spite of Sweltering Heat Support for clinic created for growing families evident in attendance

YAKIMA – On the hottest day on record, regional leaders gathered on Summitview Avenue to celebrate the groundbreaking of a new 35,000-square-foot state-of-the-art health care facility. Those in attendance included Senator Curtis King, Representative Chris Corey, Yakima County Commissioner LaDon Lindy, and Yakima County Commissioner Amanda McKinney.

"This facility will be an economic boon to our community and to our valley. It is something that is sorely, sorely needed, particularly at this time in our history," said Senator King.

The new family health clinic will also specialize in OB/GYN care. "Nationally, there is an effort to improve the health outcomes of rural women and their babies. This clinic is not only focusing on moms but also on their whole family," continues Olivares.

"It's no secret there's a shortage of primary care services for everyone in our community," Yakima Valley Farm Workers Clinic CEO Carlos Olivares said. "It always has been and always will be our mission to build where there is a need."

This family-approach at the new clinic will aim to ensure that pregnant mothers have access to care early in their pregnancy, which will improve maternal health outcomes, decrease pre-term births, and decrease low birthweight.

Yakima Valley Farm Workers Clinic has enlisted Colorado-based design-build firm Neenan Archistruction to design and construct the 35,000 square foot state-of-the-art facility. The new clinic will employ more than 50 people, including nine health care providers. The health center will provide family medicine, OB/GYN, laboratory, and pharmacy services, all under one roof with design features that aim to support better access and seamless service across care units.

"We are committed to providing the best quality care to Yakima families and mothers-to-be," Olivares said.

The Neenan Archistruction's collaborative and integrated approach is well suited to this project as Yakima Valley Farm Workers Clinic aims to focus on integrated service.

The project is scheduled for completion in the fall of 2022.
