Quality Improvement Awards

Yakima Valley Farm Workers Clinic is proud to be recognized by the national Health Resources and Services Administration for our quality of care. The Quality Improvement Awards recognize the highest performing health centers nationwide as well as those health centers that have made significant quality improvement gains from the previous year.



Health Center Quality Leader (HCQL)

Achieved the best overall clinical performance among all health centers and was recognized in the top 20% for Clinical Quality Measures (CQMs).



Health Disparities Reducer

Met or exceeded the Healthy People 2020 goals, or made at least a 10% improvement across different racial/ethnic groups.



Access Enhancer

Increased number of patients served and number of patients with access to comprehensive services.



Advancing Health Information Technology (HIT) for Quality

Optimized health information technology services for advancing telehealth, patient engagement, interoperability, and collection of social determinants of health to increase access to care and advance quality of care.

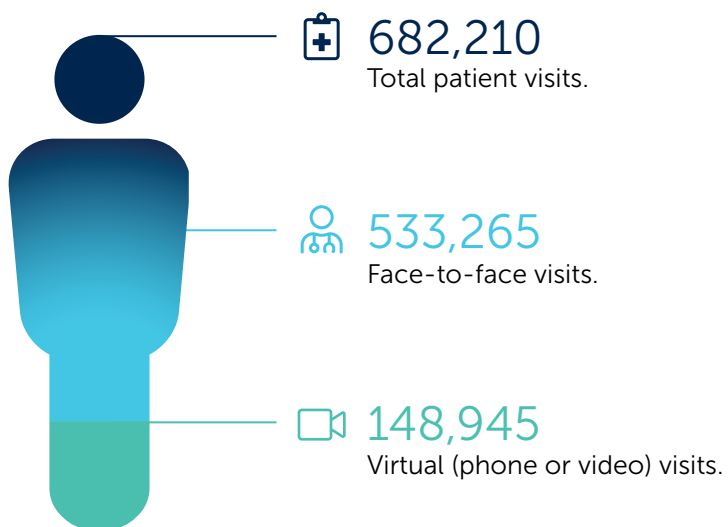
Target: BP Gold-Level Recognition

We are one of the largest community health centers in the Pacific Northwest bringing medical, dental, pharmacy, behavioral health, nutritional services, and more to people in need.

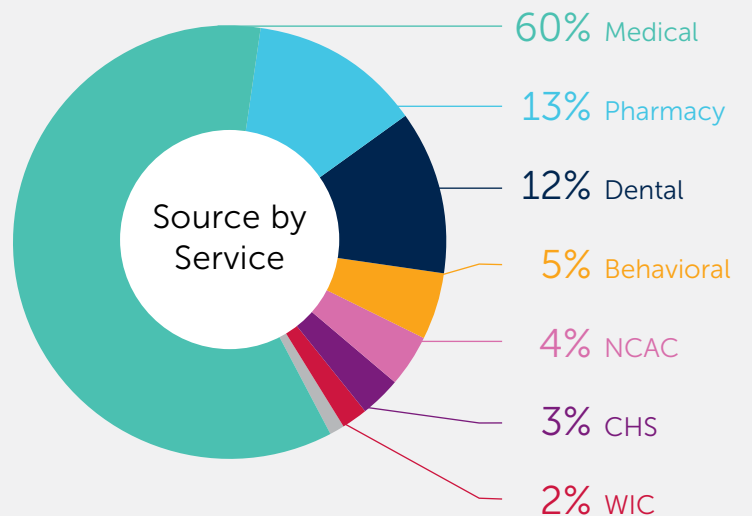
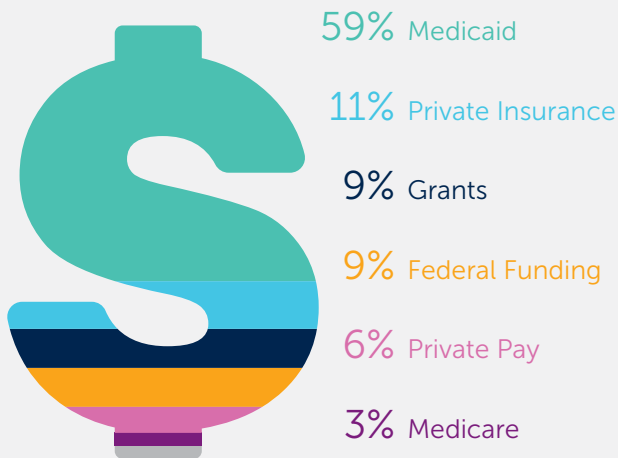

Individuals impacted by our special supplemental nutrition program, WIC.

Our WIC Program aims to safeguard the health of low-income women, infants, and children up to age 5 who are at nutrition risk by providing nutritious foods to supplement diets, information on healthy eating, and referrals to health care.

NCAC is a program created to help individuals and families to achieve a greater level of self-sufficiency. It includes education services, citizenship classes, employment and training programs, homeless services, seniors programs, SNAP-Ed, and much more.

A growing network of care.

New clinic completed to support the needs of the Tri-Cities.

With integrated services including medical, dental, and pharmacy, Miramar Health Center, Kennewick will meet many needs, all under one roof, offering approximately 32,000 appointments per year.

As part of the community, Miramar Health Center, Kennewick will add as many as 70 new jobs.



New clinic opened at Gateway to better serve our Portland Community.

Our third location in Portland, Oregon opened amid the pandemic to provide dependable, compassionate health care to those in need. Our Gateway team bolstered our primary health care, immunizations, lab services, virtual visits, and interpreter services during one of the most trying times for the area.

Yakima Valley Farm Workers Clinic built and accelerated programs to support our vulnerable communities across the Pacific Northwest.

- Incident Command Center structure acquired timely protective equipment, updated infection control protocols, and improved employee health policies to our staff
- Video & telehealth visits accounted for nearly 22% of all encounters
- Mail delivery pharmacy retools to deliver temperature-sensitive medications
- Partnership with 2nd Harvest safely provided food to needy families
- +35,000 COVID-19 tests administered
- Over half a million COVID-19 screenings performed in 2020
- 340 COVID-19 vaccines administered in the final days of 2020 (over 100,000 vaccines were administered through the Spring 2021)

These advancements, investments, and partnerships will serve our communities well beyond the pandemic. We thank our many heroes who worked tirelessly to bring these efforts to life and protected the most vulnerable among us.
