Wright has extensive healthcare management experience working for health care organizations such as Oregon Health Science University (OHSU), Kaiser Permanente, and as Senior Clinic Manager for Multnomah County Health Department and State Health Refugee Clinic. "I'm passionate about providing equitable healthcare and making sustainable changes in the Rosewood community, " Wright stated.

Wright led a vaccine equity effort for OHSU, working with diverse populations to empower and build trust within communities of color to seek accessible, equitable, and inclusive healthcare. I'm helping underserved communities learn how to trust our healthcare systems when they have historically failed us." Wright stated.

Wright feels connected with the Rosewood community and is eager to impact those living in the area. "The people and patients of this neighborhood inspired me to take this position. I look forward to having real conversations about what is needed and missing from the healthcare community." Wright stated.

In 2023, Wright will be managing a new 35,437 square feet multi-disciplinary health center, "I look forward to the new clinic opening, where patients can get high quality medical care, stop in for a dental cleaning, and pick up their prescriptions on the way home," Wright stated.
