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Unify Community Health Welcomes UW School of Dentistry RIDE Student

SPOKANE, WA - Yakima Valley Farmworkers Clinic's Unify Community Health, Northeast Community Center, welcomes Doctor of Dental Surgery (DDS) candidate Hayden Jones. Jones, a fourth-year student in the University of Washington School of Dentistry's (UWSOD) Regional Initiatives in Dental Education (RIDE) program. As part of the RIDE program, he will be training at the clinic for fivemonths. During this time, Jones will help the clinic increase dental patient capacity while he trains to become one of the next generation of rural oral health care providers.

Across the state, rural areas have fewer dental providers and, as a result, residents have less access to dental care. The RIDE program prepares dentists for practice in rural and underserved areas of Washington, by training students in a specially focused track of the DDS curriculum. RIDE students spend their first year of dental school at Eastern Washington University in Spokane, WA, and complete two clinical rotations at Community Health Centers in Central or Eastern Washington. By immersing students in rural and underserved communities, and providing extensive clinical training, RIDE equips students to meet the unique challenges of practicing in more remote regions. Since its inception in 2009, over 80-percent of RIDE DDS graduates have returned to work in rural and underserved communities. With the support of local organizations like Unify Community Health, RIDE prepares dentists to work in communities that need it most.

"Getting more oral healthcare providers into rural and underserved areas is key to improving the overall health of our communities," said Dr. Frank Roberts, Director of the University of Washington's RIDE Program. "Time and time again, we see that the quality of a person's overall health is strongly connected to the quality of their oral health. And good oral health depends on access to regular care from a trained oral health professional."

Jones completed his second-year clinical rotation in his hometown of Spokane in 2021 and is excited to return for his five-month senior dental rotation. He is set to graduate this June and plans to attend the Advanced Education in General Dentistry program in South Carolina. Afterward, he hopes to return to Spokane or its surrounding areas to establish his dental practice.

Unify Community Health, located in Spokane's Northeast Community Center, is a part of the Yakima Valley Farm Workers Clinic organization, one of the largest community health centers in the Pacific Northwest. Unify Community Health has been serving the diverse population of Spokane for over 40 years, providing a wide range of dental services, with an emphasis placed on children's oral health.
