Yakima Valley Farm Workers Clinic Looking for Employer Nominations

Nominations sought for 2025 Employer Excellence in Breastfeeding Support Award

YAKIMA COUNTY – Breastmilk and breastfeeding has many proven health benefits for both babies and mothers alike, and Yakima Valley Farm Workers Clinic is seeking nominations of employers who demonstrate excellence in providing support for breastfeeding mothers.

Yakima Valley Farm Workers Clinic is hosting the eighth annual, 2025 Employer Excellence in Breastfeeding Support Award. The winner will be announced during World Breastfeeding Week in August.

"We want to reward employers who are going beyond the basic requirements of providing their employees with breastfeeding support," said Heather McCrory, Nutrition Services WA WIC Regional Manager. "Highlighting employers who clearly value the health of their employees and their families is instrumental in expanding employee breastfeeding support in the workplace."

According to McCrory, making accommodations for breastfeeding can actually improve a business's bottom line.

"Employees who breastfeed are more easily retained, have less sick time and contribute to lower health care and insurance costs," said McCrory. "Breastfeeding can be foundational in providing an infant with the best start possible and set them up for success as they grow older."

Workplace breastfeeding support might look like:

- A private pumping or nursing area with
 - o a comfortable chair
 - o an electrical outlet
- A small table for pumping
- A sink with running water for clean up
- A flexible break schedule for pumping

Gold Star employers might also include:

- An in-room refrigerator for breast milk storage
- Affordable onsite childcare
